

Glynis Kenny, Bachelor of Nursing, RGN RHV

Glynis Kenny has 26 years experience of nursing. Following her initial training in 1982, she completed a further year gaining a diploma in Orthopaedics. In 1989 she undertook a four-year nursing degree course at the University of Manchester and also gained her Health Visitor qualification. After working in the field of Health Visiting and Practice Nursing and having two children, she won a scholarship to study for a post graduate research degree at the University of Manchester studying neurogenic bowel dysfunction in spinal cord injured adults. She also has some experience of giving specific lectures within the University.

Following her orthopaedic diploma, Glynis Kenny went on to work at the Spinal Injury Unit in Pinderfields Hospital, Wakefield. She worked here for a period of two years and in 1985, she met her husband on the unit, who is himself a paraplegic. She has 20 valuable years' experience of living and coping with disability and bringing up two children. After leaving the spinal injury unit, Glynis Kenny worked in theatre, mostly assisting orthopaedic surgery. While studying for her degree, she also worked on the Orthopaedic Unit at Wythenshawe Hospital, Manchester and in the Accident and Emergency Unit.

In 1993, Glynis Kenny qualified and worked as a Health Visitor and Practice Nurse, specialising in disability where possible. She gained valuable experience in assessment and management of families with special needs, co-ordinating and chairing case conferences and costing high dependency cases.

Following her study into neurogenic bowel dysfunction in spinal cord injured adults Glynis Kenny began working as a case manager in rehabilitation. This entailed travelling all over the country to visit and carry out initial needs assessments on clients whose injuries ranged from minor whiplash to severe life changing injury such as spinal cord injury, brain injury and amputations and other multiple injury cases. Many cases were also treated and supported for post traumatic stress disorder. Case management was undertaken where necessary and she was responsible for planning and arranging the care, liaison with patients, solicitors and insurers to ensure all care was carried out as proposed.

Glynis Kenny's interests and experience lies in the field of spinal cord injury and other major multiple injury cases.
