

Kirsty Campbell, Registered General Nurse

Kirsty Campbell is a Registered General Nurse with extensive post qualification experience. She trained at Aberdeen Royal Infirmary, where she practised general nursing. Following this she held a variety of nursing positions both in acute and rehabilitation settings in Scotland and New Zealand.

In 2001 Kirsty entered the field of Case Management working for the government accident compensation scheme, New Zealand. She managed a serious injury portfolio of clients who had sustained serious brain injuries, spinal injuries and serious trauma. Kirsty also managed paediatric serious injury claims including cerebral palsy, burns, and child abuse cases.

During 2004 Kirsty case managed work injury claims for several prominent New Zealand companies. She provided vocational rehabilitation which facilitated the claimants from injury, back to independence. In 2005 Kirsty received an award for Outstanding Service Quality in Case Management.

Kirsty Campbell later became Service Delivery Manager. She managed a team of Case Managers, business relationships and account management for large companies for the lower North Island and South Island, New Zealand.

In August 2007 Kirsty returned to the UK to further her career in case management. As a Clinical Case Manager she managed adults who had sustained an acquired brain injury or spinal injury. She also is experienced in the management of children who have cerebral palsy. Kirsty travelled extensively throughout England undertaking Initial Needs Assessments and providing a comprehensive case management service.

Kirsty Campbell has maintained her registration with the NMC (The Nursing and Midwifery Council). She is a member of BABICM (The British Association of Brain Injury Case Managers) and also a member of CMSUK (The Case Management Society of the UK).

In 2010 Kirsty commenced work with Bush and Company Rehabilitation undertaking Immediate Needs Assessments and Case Management.
