For three years she ran a general practice for the wives and families of British soldiers serving the UN in Cyprus. She worked as a Welfare Officer for Boots the Chemist, visiting clients at home and at work and providing a counselling service, practical help with returning to work after illness or injury, and writing reports for financial claims in cases of hardship.
