

Sue Tucker, Registered Nurse

Sue Tucker, RGN, Dip N (Lond), RCNT, is a registered general nurse. She trained at St. Helens and Knowsley School of Nursing. Sue then completed the six month full-time ENB 100 (General Intensive Care Nursing) course in 1977. Following this she nursed critically ill patients with a wide variety of conditions in Intensive Care at Whiston Hospital, Prescot, Merseyside as staff nurse, sister, and sister deputy-in-charge.

During this time she also gained the Diploma in Nursing through London University over a two year period, 1980 and 1981. Prior to her nurse training she also had experience of intensive care as a relative visiting her father who was a patient in intensive care intermittently over an eighteen month period.

In 1982 Sue studied for and qualified as a Registered Clinical Nurse Teacher and for a year taught student nurses within the clinical setting. Following this she returned to General Intensive Care as Clinical Teacher for ENB course No 100 teaching post-registration nurses.

Following the arrival of her children she then worked on a part-time basis as staff nurse in Intensive Care.

In 1996 Sue became a school nurse and has worked in both Knowsley and Halton and St. Helens PCT's. In this role she has liaised on a daily basis with the multi-disciplinary team and has written case conference reports. She has been a case holder with responsibility to ensure children are able to access the child health core programme, to deliver this and to act in an advisory capacity to parents, teachers and children and young people of school age. The role also included assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation of care packages.

In 2009 she gained a certificate in personal, social, health education at degree level through Roehampton University.

Sue has over 37 years experience of nursing. She joined Bush & Company in 2011 preparing immediate needs reports and undertaking case management of adults and children with a range of complex difficulties.
